
The first step starts here!

We'll roam around magical towns between the mountains, staying in hostels and huts, experiencing local and traditional life, and undoubtedly savoring the traditional cuisine.





Waking up ready in our swim clothes, excited for a full day at the stunning *Semuc Champey*, where a river flows beneath another!


With a short hike through the area and a few stairs to climb, nothing's going to stop us!






